DESCRIPTION

The SWIS (Settlement Worker in Schools) Worker is responsible to the Settlement Services Manager for coordination of essential services, educational programs and for the delivery of orientation services to refugee and immigrant students and their families with the aim of facilitating their integration into the school system. The position is also responsible for the coordination of cross cultural and anti-racism education/activities for school personnel and non-immigrant students.

This position requires the knowledge and awareness of the challenges common to high-risk refugee/immigrant youth and families and of the cultural values and practices within refugee/immigrant communities. Requirements will also include knowledge of the settlement process (orientation, adaptation, integration), the demonstrated ability to relate to youth and families undergoing high degrees of stress and the aptitude to handle high stress and emotionally demanding work environments. Knowledge of the environment and philosophy/values of local and rural public & catholic school systems as well as the needs of immigrant/refugee and community resources is also essential.
