On June 12<sup>th</sup> 2007 we had 4 staff members who were awesome and volunteered to come to Regina and help me pick up 24 Karen refugees from northern Thailand and got them settled into temporary accommodations. I am happy to say the Karen's are now into permanent homes and are going to school. They all say they like Canada very much and are integrating quite well into Canada.
