June 20 marks the seventh annual World Refugee Day, bringing further attention to refugee crises worldwide. In 2005 there were more than 19 million refugees, a 13 percent increase from the previous year.

Since 2003 more than two million Darfurians have fled to neighboring Chad, forced to abandon their homes and livelihoods in order to escape the ever growing violence in Sudan.

International Medical Corps has provided critical emergency medical and health related services. More than three million refugees rely on humanitarian aid to stay alive in Darfur and Chad alone.

Child care is provided free of charge.


Stories from the students
